Reflection

Remembrance

As each name is read a member of the Bereavement Team will light a candle to place before the altar in their memory.

Reader: Tonight we remember our relatives and friends who have died. In a special way we call to mind those from this parish, and all those associated with our parish, who died during the past year. We remember *(names will be read out one by one)*



After the names have been read out, and the candles lit, a moment of quiet for your own prayer.

now and forever


Breaking of Bread:

lost in wonder, love, and praise.




